DAY OF PRAYER AND FASTING FOR PEACE

Pope Francis has designated Friday in the First Week of Lent, 23 Feb 2018 as a Day of Prayer and Fasting for Peace in the World, especially in the Democratic Republic of Congo and in South Sudan, which both have been suffering conflicts for some time now.

"Peace is a precious gift which must be promoted and protected... Never has the use of violence brought peace in its wake. War begets war, violence begets violence."

40 DAYS FOR LIFE:

What are you doing for Lent? Will you watch and pray one hour with us each week this Lent to pray for a culture of life in Scotland? 40 Days for Life is a growing grassroots pro-life lay movement which seeks to replace the culture of death with a culture of life. This year marks the 50th anniversary of the implementation of abortion in the UK. During this time the UK has aborted more than 8.7m babies, more than half a million of these babies have been Scottish children (Source: ISD Online)
