### JUSTICE AND PEACE

Christian Solidarity Worldwide on their website are organising a petition that will be handed in on 1 June, International Children's Day. School textbooks in Pakistan are littered with discriminatory ideas and hate speech, teaching that Christians are inferior and don't belong in Pakistan. So many of the injustices we see in our world today are rooted in hatred that's learned in a child's early years. Religious fundamentalism is at worrying levels in Pakistan, with terrorism claiming hundreds of lives over the past few years alone. To stop this tide of violence, we need to tackle hatred in the education system before it takes root. Isaac was forced to give up on his dreams. He was told that because he's Christian, all he'll ever be is a cleaner. We want to make sure that textbooks no longer entrench this view, and instead celebrate the contribution of religious minorities and foster diversity. Pakistan receives more in UK aid than any other country. It's right that we should give to a country where so many children live in poverty. However, we also need to ensure that instead of fuelling prejudice, our money is enabling children to help themselves out of poverty and become good citizens. The petition will go to both the Foreign Secretary and the Secretary of State for International Development.

### HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE

Pilgrimage scheduled for Sept 15-24 linking Glasgow and its twin city of Bethlehem. The Archdiocesan pilgrimage has been running for more than 10 years, organised by former Lord Provost Alex Mosson. The 2018 pilgrimage has prices capped at £1095. The price includes connecting flights with Turkish Airlines from Edinburgh, stopping at Istanbul before touch down in Tel Aviv. ### GOING INTO HOSPITAL?

If you wish to see a Catholic Chaplain during your stay in hospital, you need to ask the hospital staff to contact him. There is always a priest on call for emergencies, but staff will not page the priest unless asked by patients or Families

Patient's Religious Declaration, which a person when admitted to hospital, or a relative/friend, should give to ward-staff to ensure they can see a Catholic Chaplain. This can also be achieved through a verbal-request to staff. This is necessary due to the way confidentiality rules are applied in most hospitals.
