The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, states that the Ambo (Lectern) is only to be used for the proclamation of Sacred Scripture, the Responsorial psalm, the homily, the General Intercessions and also the Easter Proclamation (Exsultet). The dignity of the ambo requires that only a minister of the word should go up to it. This means that from now on, in St Gregory's, any announcements, letters, appeals and eulogies will be done from a different lectern.
